Sadly, we lost our beloved Bill to a brief battle with pancreatic cancer at the age of 62. Although he is no longer with us, his legacy will live on through his employees, partners, friends, and family.

Bill was born in Clanton, Alabama, but moved to Milton at an early age. He attended Milton public schools, Pensacola Jr. College, and Florida State University. He leaves behind his wife of 42 years Toni, his two sons Damon (Carrie) Hadder, Trevor (Brittany) Hadder and two grandsons Jason and Landon Hadder all of Pace.

Bill was a veteran of the Insurance Industry since 1976. He founded William H. Hadder Insurance in 1986 and merged with Donnie and John McMahon in 1999 to start McMahon and Hadder Insurance. They are now one of Pensacola's premier insurance agencies. Bill oversaw human resources, accounting, training, and was the agency general manager. Bill was awarded a certificate of participation for having more than 15 years as a designated CIC (Certified Insurance Counselor) which is a not-for-profit organization of the The National Alliance for Insurance Education and Research.

Bill was a Dave Ramsey endorsed local provider and personal financial educator. He is a past president of the Independent Insurance Agents of Pensacola, a past member of the Pensacola and Pace Area Chamber of Commerce, Professional Insurance Agents of FL, and past Advisory Council Member of the Radford Locklin Technical Center.

Bill was a charter member of the Pace Rotary Club. He served as past Vice-President and President, past Member of the Year, the Sergeant at Arms, and Mr. Sunshine. Bill holds Paul Harris Fellow awards and had 19 years of devoted service with perfect attendance.

Bill was a member of the Gateway Church of Christ and enjoyed the leadership capacity of the Community Outreach program for over 5 years, which was developed to aid the hungry and homeless of Pensacola.
